**First Serve**

The Youngstown State volleyball team opens the 2007 season officially this weekend at the Temple Tournament, Aug. 24-25, in Philadelphia, Pa.

The Penguins open the tourney against LaSalle, Friday, at 11 a.m. before squaring off against Lehigh at 5 p.m.

On Saturday, the Guins battle Rider at 9 a.m. and close out the tournament against host Temple at 1 p.m.

LaSalle went 9-24 last season but returns eight letterwinners and five starters from last year's squad. Among the returning players for the Explorers are junior middle hitters Christa Dominick and Amy McKeon, who compiled the top two hitting percentages on the team last year. Dominick hit for an overall efficiency of .317 to lead the team, while McKeon hit for .214. Joining them this year will be freshman Jill Mohr, also a middle hitter. A native of Mentor, OH, Mohr led Lake Catholic High School in kills the past two years.

Lehigh is coming off a 0-29 campaign in 2006 and returns 10 letterwinners and three starters. Sophomore outside hitters Brittany Thurston and Mo McReynolds headline the Mountain Hawks' returning offensive weapons from last season. Thurston posted 202 kills while added 116.

The Rider Broncs posted an 8-21 record last season but return five starters from a year ago. Junior outside hitter Lacey Johnson led the Broncs with 287 kills and a 2.71 kills per game average last season.

Temple opens the 2007 campaign after finishing the 2006 season with a 16-14 overall mark and a first-place 8-5 record in the East Division of the Atlantic-10 Conference.

The Owls, who were picked to repeat as East Division champs, return four starters from last season's squad including two-time First-Team All-Atlantic-10 selection Yue Liu. Liu, who has 1,241 career kills entering her final season, pounded 441 kills with a .273 hitting percentage last season.

**Up Next**

Next on YSU's 2007 slate is a three-match tournament at Robert Morris, Aug. 31 - Sept. 1.

The Penguins take on UNC-Greensboro next Friday at 4 p.m. On Saturday, YSU confronts North Dakota State at 11 a.m. at Duquesne University and closes out the tournament against Robert Morris at 3 p.m. in Moon Township, Pa.

**Boscaljon Nets League Honors**

Last season, sophomore Ruth Boscaljon became the first volleyball player in school history to earn All-Horizon League honors. The 6-foot-3 middle hitter led the Penguins with 363 kills, 3.27 kills per game average, 128 blocks, 1.15 blocks per game and a .300 hitting percentage. Boscaljon was also tabbed the Horizon League's Co-Newcomer of the Year.

**Everhart Named Team MVP**

In her first season with the team, junior setter Karla Everhart was named the team's most valuable player for the 2006 campaign. Everhart tallied 1,125 assists, 10.25 assists per game, 300 digs, 121 kills and 40 blocks. She also posted 17 double-doubles and just missed three triple doubles. Everhart's 33 service aces was also a team high.

For the second straight season and the third time in the last four years, the Youngstown State volleyball team will take on the na-

tionally-ranked Ohio State Buckeyes, Tues., Sept. 4, at 7 p.m. at St. John Arena.

The Buckeyes enter the 2007 campaign ranked No. 16 in the CSTV/AVCA Pre-season Coaches Poll. Last season, the Penguins hosted the Buckeyes for the first time in school history but lost, 3-0.

#### Fraley Approaching Milestone

Senior right side hitter Jessica Fraley is approaching two milestones. Fraley, who has missed much of each of the last two seasons due to abdominal injuries, needs 26 more kills to reach 600 for her career and 33 more digs to collect 400 career digs. Fraley holds the YSU single-match kills record with 31 kills against Canisius during the 2005 season.

#### Barbosa Makes Major Improvement

Last season, junior Ebony Barbosa finished with 299 kills and 317 digs as a sophomore. As a freshman in 2005, Barbosa tallied just 110 kills with just 47 digs and a .010 hitting percentage.

#### Everhart Already in Top 10

Junior setter Karla Everhart made the most of her first season running the offense in 2006. Last season, Everhart dished out 1,125 assists and 10.32 assists per game, which rank seventh and eighth on the YSU single-season list, respectively. Her 1,182 career assists place her seventh on the all-time chart.

#### O'Hara Shined in Shortened Season

Sophomore Kaitlin O'Hara fared quite well in her rookie campaign despite missing six matches due to an injury. O'Hara posted 197 kills, a 2.40 kills per game average and a 0.84 blocks per game average last season.

#### Barbosa Double-Dippin'

Junior Ebony Barbosa improved her all-around game last season. The native of Allentown, Pa., tallied 16 double-doubles which was second only to Everhart's 17.

#### Season Outlook

It happens every year.

College coaches reflect upon the lessons learned - both good and bad - from the previous season in an effort to ascertain what it will take to make the next step in building a championship contender.

For Youngstown State and Head Coach Joe Bonner, 2006's three-win improvement from the year before while often using several freshman and two inexperienced sophomores is a move in the right direction. But now, expectations continue to rise.

A significant challenge to the Penguins' rise in the Horizon League will be the relative youth of the 2007 roster. Of the 13 players on the team, 10 are sophomores and freshmen with only one senior and two juniors.

Seven players, however, have at least a year of college playing experience and the entire squad's versatility and depth are two keys factors Bonner believes will bring the Penguins success.

#### Setter

Returning to run the offense for the second straight season is junior setter Karla Everhart.

Everhart, who already ranks seventh all-time with 1,182 career assists, dished out 1,125 assists and averaged 10.32 assists per game during her sophomore season.

Suffering from a foot injury, Everhart did not compete in the spring but still displayed true leadership characteristics.

Freshman Dani Soubliere, an all-state performer from Howell, Mich., is expected to get playing time as Everhart's backup.

#### Outside Hitter

Probably the most athletic and the area with the most depth is at the outside hitter position.

Only two of the five outside hitters listed on the roster have college experience at that spot but Bonner has a tremendous amount of confidence in those players.

Junior Ebony Barbosa is the most experienced of the outside hitters with 409 ca-

In two short seasons, Youngstown State Volleyball Head Coach Joe Bonner has already put his stamp on the Penguins volleyball program.

Bonner, who is entering his third season, continually dedicates his energies to turning the Penguins into one of the top teams in the Horizon League and the region.

In May 2006, his recruiting class ranked in the top 100 by prepvolleyball.com.

One of those recruits, Ruth Boscaljon, became the first Youngstown State volleyball player to earn First-Team All-Horizon League and just the second player in school history to garner the newcomer-of-the-year award.

Utilizing three freshmen and two limited-experienced sophomores for much of the 2006 season, the Penguins turned in a three-match improvement in the win column from Bonner's first year.

Boscaljon set a Youngstown State freshman record with 363 kills and 115 blocks while sophomore setter Karla Everhart dished out 1,125 assists.

During his initial campaign, Bonner guided the Penguins through an injury-plagued 7-22 season, but he instilled a strong competitive desire. Included in the Penguins' losses were five five-game setbacks, all to Horizon League foes.

Abby Ettenhofer, Katie Shea and Crystal Duncan each capped their playing days with career-best numbers. Ettenhofer led the team with 334 kills while Shea owned a team-best 106 blocks and Duncan added 173 kills and 153 digs.

Bonner's players also made strides off the court. Ettenhofer, the president of YSU's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, was named Second-Team Academic All-America, becoming just the second YSU volleyball player to accomplish that feat.

Bonner was named the seventh head coach of the Youngstown State volleyball program on Feb. 4, 2005, after spending two seasons as the top assistant coach at the University of Dayton.

Bonner helped the Flyers to a two-year mark of 49-16, including a 23-9 overall ledger in 2004, and two straight trips to the NCAA Tournament.

In 2004, the Flyers also won their second straight Atlantic-10 regular-season championship with a 12-2 conference mark. While at Dayton, Bonner worked primarily with the middle hitters and blockers. In addition to his on-court duties, he was responsible for team travel, game operations and assisting with recruiting.

Prior to Dayton, Bonner, who has been to five NCAA Tournaments, spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Robert Morris (2000-2002) and helped the Colonials to three consecutive Northeast Conference titles and three straight NCAA Tournaments.

While at Robert Morris, Bonner was responsible for the development of the middle hitters. Under his guidance, four middle hitters received all-conference honors and one earned NEC Player-of-the-Year accolades for two consecutive years.

He also was the travel and recruiting coordinator and served as the team's strength and conditioning coach.

Outside of the college realm, Bonner also has four years of collegiate club volleyball coaching experience.

A 1997 graduate of Frostburg State University, Bonner's club team made two national tournament appearances, as well as three years of USAV competition.

A native of Huntingtown, Md., Bonner received a Bachelor of Science degree in Economics from Frostburg State.

Joe and his wife, Kelly, who was a four-year volleyball letterwinner at Mars Hills College, reside in Austintown, Ohio.

reer kills, including 299 last season as a sophomore.

Sophomore Dana Leslie, who tallied 10 kills and appeared in 15 matches last season mostly during the later stages of the campaign, showed a lot of improvement during the spring season and is poised to contribute on the left side.

Sophomore Kaitlin O'Hara is one of three new faces on the left side for Bonner. The 6-foot-2 native of Canandaigua, N.Y., is making the transition to outside hitter from middle hitter where she recorded 197 kills and 69 blocks while missing a month due to a shoulder injury.

Freshmen Kesli Bitter and Abigail Drost, who enrolled in school in January, round out the left-side hitters.

### Middle Hitters

The position which achieved the most success last season and one of the most veteran on the team is in the middle.

Sophomores Ruth Boscaljon and Allison Heinz combined for 454 kills and 203 blocks as freshmen last season.

Boscaljon also was named to the All-Horizon League First-Team and captured Co-Newcomer of the Year in 2006 after boasting a YSU freshmen record 363 kills and 128 blocks. Meanwhile, Heinz nailed 191 kills and 75 total blocks last season.

Newcomer Haley Kapferer, a 2006 Wendy's High School Heisman candidate, could also see time in the middle.

As a senior at Jefferson Area High School, Kapferer notched 271 kills and 86 blocks and was named the conference player of the year.

### Right Side Hitters

Three-year letterwinner and the lone senior on the club Jessica Fraley returns for her final season on the right side.

A 2004 Horizon League All-Newcomer Team pick, Fraley has been hampered by two abdominal surgeries over the last two seasons but is back healthy.

During her freshman campaign, Fraley collected 360 kills and 270 digs but has appeared in just 28 matches over the last two seasons due to injury.

Freshman Tasha Reid from Avonmore, Pa., is also slated to see action on the right side.

Tasha is a strong blocker and versatile player that needs some seasoning," Bonner said. "She's has a tremendous upside."

### Defensive Specialists/Libero

The Penguins will have to recoup their biggest losses from last season's back row lineup. Replacing last year's defensive specialists/liberos Amanda Cindric, Cari Leslie and Janelle McDonald, who compiled a combined 3,261 career digs, may be Bonner's toughest task this season and begins with newcomer Laurie Shives.

Shives, a *Columbus Dispatch* "20 Area High School Volleyball Players to Watch" selection, was named her team's best defensive player and collected 347 digs during her senior season at Central Crossing High School.
